#### **BASIC CONCEPTS:**

- Grants are funds or other resources disbursed by one party (funder), often a government agency, corporation, foundation or trust, to a recipient (grantee)
- Grantees are often (but not always) nonprofit or public entities
- In order to receive a grant some form of proposal or an application, is usually required
- Most grants are made to fund a specific project and require compliance and reporting
- ➡ Grants almost always involve an applicant submitting a proposal to a potential funder, either on the applicant's own initiative or in response to a Request for Proposal (RFP) from the funder
- Other grants can be given to individuals, such as scientific researchers, students, and individuals who seek to open a small business
- Largely, grantors require that grantees have some form of tax-exemption via nonprofit incorporation or establishment as a government entity
- ➡ Grants range in size from large, such as those negotiated at the government policy level, to very small, like those given college students to purchase books or supplies
- The average federal grant given to a school or district is approximately \$200,000 per year, but these often span several years and amount to about \$1,000,000






#### **GRANT ALIGNMENT - The 5 Minute Fitness Test**



- Find and review the RFP
  - Confirm eligibility
  - Confirm purpose alignment
  - Confirm geographic reach
  - Always make sure your agency isn't specifically prohibited!

## **IMPROVING YOUR APPROACH**



## **BEST PRACTICES:**

- Analyze the Evidence-Base to determine which interventions get the best results.
  - National Education Association
  - Northwest Regional Education Lab
  - Southwest Region Education Board
  - U.S. Department of Education/Best Practices
- Review the program design of other grantees.
  - Contact the Program Officer of the grant and ask for a copy of the top-rated proposal
  - Contact the grantee
  - The FOIA Request (Demand copy of top-rated proposal by invoking the Freedom of Information Act.)

## **SUSTAINABILITY:**

Since grant funding is almost always temporary, grantors want to know how their dollars will affect lasting change.

- Identify and affect policy needed to bring about change.
- Identify potential partners and donors that might contribute to the project once the funding has been spent.
- Discuss alignment with state standards or new policy developments to let grantors know that your intervention has the potential to be institutionalized.
- Add Value!



### **ELEMENTS OF A STRONG PROPOSAL:**

- 1. Connection to science or engineering research and education.
- 2. Ability to identify science drivers specific R & E projects
- 3. Compelling needs statement/gap analysis
- 4. Stacked and Latticed credentials for project staff
- 5. Unique characteristics of your team
- 6. Available resources, STEM curriculum/investments, student demographics
- 7. Incorporation of technology-based interventions
- 8. Alignment with state or federal standards
- 9. Broad community involvement and support
- 10. Impressive program impact
- 11. Tracking and reporting processes
- 12. Plan for continuous improvement and sustainability
- 13. Accounting controls
- 14. Budget alignment with narrative
- 15. CONSISTENCY



## **REJECTIONS:**

- Score sheets, reviewer's notes
- Address gaps in program design
- Notify partners and stakeholders of your intent to reapply
- Attend regional/national training events and conferences to bolster competencies
- Host quarterly conference calls with your partners to discuss the status of the re-application (keep minutes)
- Down-Slate Funding
- Ask for help!
  - Project Officer
  - Other grantees
